ORDER

In the G.O. first to third read above, Government have issued orders for sanction of certain terminal benefits to the State Government employees permanently absorbed in SPSUs, Boards, Universities, Local Bodies, Cooperative Institutions etc. As per these orders, these employees are eligible for pension if they have put in a service of not less than 10 years in Government. But they are not eligible for family pension as they ceased to be Government employees w.e.f the date of their absorption in SPSUs etc.

- 2. The retired employees of Government absorbed in certain State Public Sector Undertakings/Central Public Sector Undertakings have been continuously representing to the Government for favourable consideration of their request for family pension for the following reasons:
 - a) Government of India have allowed family pension to the families of Central Government employees permanently absorbed in Central Public Sector Undertakings based on the Supreme Court Orders.
 - b) The families of State Government employees permanently absorbed in Tamil Nadu Co-operative Milk Producers Federation Limited have become eligible for family pension based on orders issued by the Government in the G.O. Ms.No.55, AH&F Department dated 26.04.2000.
 - c) In G.O. (Ms) No.110, Transport Department dated 06.06.2002 Govt. have issued orders sanctioning family pension to those families of erstwhile Transport Department employees absorbed permanently in State Transport Undertakings based on orders passed by the High Court.
