



ABSTRACT

ORDER:

The Director of Technical Education in his letter read above, has sent a proposal to the Government for permitting him to admit students in the Government Engineering Colleges under Non-Resident Indian (N.R.I.) Quota for the year 2003-2004.

2. The total intake in the six Government Engineering Colleges is 1520. The Director of Technical Education has suggested admitting 10% of the sanctioned strength over and above the intake for admission under N.R.I. category. He has said that for the present Anna University is charging 35,000 U.S. Dollars per course for I.T. related subjects and 25,000 U.S. Dollars per course in respect of other courses for admission of students under the N.R.I. quota in Anna University Colleges. Following the above precedent of the Anna University, the Director of Technical Education has requested that he may be permitted to admit students under N.R.I. quota upto 10% of the sanctioned intake of the Colleges in each course over and above the present sanctioned strength. He has suggested that a fee of 25,000 U.S. Dollars as one time fee for the course or 6500 U.S. Dollars per annum may be fixed. The break up details of the fees suggested are as follows:

Tuition fees (including Special fees and Laboratory fees)	US \$ 1625/- p.a.	US \$ 6250 per course
Development fees	US \$ 4875/- p.a.	US \$18750/- per course
Total	US \$ 6500/- p.a.	US \$ 25000/- per course

The Director has suggested that 75% of the income generated through N.R.I. admission may be given to the respective Colleges for the development of the institution and upgradation of Research and teaching standards in the Colleges. He has suggested that the 75% of the Revenue may be kept in the P.D. account (Personal Deposit Account) of the Director of Technical Education and the same will be released to the Colleges as and when required. The remaining 25% of the Revenue generated will be remitted to the Government account.

4. At present students under N.R.I. quota are admitted by the Self-Financing Engineering Colleges and Government Aided Engineering Colleges. Students are not admitted under this category in the Government Engineering Colleges. However, this kind of admission is already in Vogue in Anna University Colleges. As, it is proposed to admit students under N.R.I. quota to the level of 10% of the sanctioned strength over and above the present sanctioned strength this proposition will not affect the prospects of local students getting admission into the Government Engineering Colleges. On the other hand this will enable the N.R.I. students to get admission in the Government Engineering Colleges. Further this will also help improve the quality of the Government Engineering Colleges through the income generated by admitting the students under N.R.I. quota.

5. For the reasons mentioned above, the Government have decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Technical Education and they accordingly direct that 10% of the students over and above the sanctioned strength be admitted in the Government Engineering colleges under N.R.I. Quota. The Government permit the Director of Technical Education to make the N.R.I. admissions by following the prescribed procedures. The following fee be prescribed for admission under N.R.I. Quota.
