## Abstract

Higher Education - Framing of comprehensive policy guidelines on University examination system - Constitution of Committee - Orders - Issued.

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## ORDER:-

In the letter first read above, the Assistant Registrar, High Court of Madras has enclosed the order of High Court of Madras in a case (Crl.O.P.No.22507/2006 and M.P.No.1/2006) in which a student of Pondicherry Engineering College, Pondicherry committed suicide after receiving exam results in which he scored less than his expectation. The victim's mother filed case against the Lecturer who had evaluated his paper. The Lecturer granted him 20 marks whereas during revaluation, marks obtained were much higher. The case was filed under Section 306 IPC and 107 IPC which pertain to abetment to suicide. The High Court of Madras in its judgement dt.16.5.2007, among others ordered as follows:-

in view of the above said serious problem resulting in the death of brilliant students, this Court is constrained to suggest that the educational institutions both private and Government should provide Pre and Post Exam Counselling System for the students, teachers and parents with a view to create positive thinking, courage and self confidence among the students to enable them to march towards a glorious future career.

 Besides this, in the Policy Note of Higher Education Department for 2007-2008, under the heading introduction-item 1-10. It has been mentioned as follows:-

There is a need for overhauling the university examination system in the State so that it aims at testing students' understanding of the concept and analyzing capacity rather than memory / cramming power. Teaching, learning and evaluation methods need to be revisited and modalities for this will have to be worked out so that the present examination system becomes more analytical and responsive to the changes. For this, a committee of experts headed by a former Vice-Chancellor will be constituted, to suggest measures to effect changes in examination system.

3. In order to consider the suggestion of High Court order and to evolve a comprehensive policy guidelines on University examination system, the Government considered to form a committee consisting of Educational Experts and Psychologists and accordingly the Government direct that the Expert Committee be constituted with the composition of following members for the above purpose:-
