**NOTIFICATION** 

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No. II (2) /LE/717/98 dated the 13th March, 1998 published at pages 172 to 174 of Part II Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette dated the 8th April 1998, the Governor of Tamil Nadu after consultation with the advisory board, hereby revises the minimum rates of wages specified in column (2) of the schedule below payable to the clauses of employees in Food Processing Industry in the State of Tamilnadu as specified in column (1) thereof, the draft of the same having been previously published as required by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act.

2. This notification shall come into force with effect, on and from the date of the publication in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.

### **EXPLANATION**

(1) Classification of zones:

Zones A and B shall comprise of the following are:-

Zone -A .. Corporation Zone-B .. Other Places

- (2) Dearness Allowance: The employees shall be paid dearness allowance as indicated below:
- i) The wages notified above is linked to the average of Chennai City Consumer Price Index for the year 1993 (i.e. 258 points with base 1982=100) and for rise of one point ever and above 258 points, increase of 4.10 (Rupees four and ten paise only) shall be paid as dearness allowance.
- ii) The revision of the Dearness allowance shall be effective from the 1st April every year on the basis of the average of the indices for the proceeding 12 (twelve) months, that is from January to December
- iii) The first calculation shall thus be effective from the date of issue of this Notification in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette based on the average of the Chennai City Consumer price index Numbers for the previous year as explained in item (ii).
- 3) (i) To arrive at daily rate of wages, the monthly rates of wages shall be divided by 26.
- (ii) To arrive at monthly rate of Dearness Allowance the daily rate of Dearness Allowance shall be multiplied by 26.
- 4) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made in the case of male and female workers.
- 5) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
