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## ORDER:

In the Government Order first read above the minimum rates of wages for the employment in Coconut Peeling were revised under the provisions of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948. The Government have now proposed to revise further these minimum rates of wages for employment in coconut peeling.

# APPENDIX. NOTIFICATION.

The following draft of a Notification, which it is proposed to issue in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) is hereby published for information of all persons likely to be affected thereby, as required by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act.

2. Notice is hereby given that the draft Notification will be taken into consideration on or after the expiry of two months from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u> and that any objection or suggestion, which may be received from any person with respect thereto, before the expiry of the aforesaid period of two months will be considered by the Government of Tamil Nadu. Objection or suggestion, if any, should be addressed to the Secretary to Government, Labour and Employment Department, Secretariat, Chennai-600 009 through the Commissioner of Labour, Chennai-600 006.

#### DRAFT NOTIFICATION.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No.II(2)/LE/ 487/2004, published at pages 295 and 296 of Part II-Section 2 of the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>, dated the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2004, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in coconut peeling, in the State of Tamil Nadu, specified in column (2) of the Schedule below as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof:-

# THE SCHEDULE. EMPLOYMENT IN COCONUT PEELING.

1.	Coconut peeling:	
(i)	Time Rate	109.50 per day
(ii)	Piece Rate	130.40 per 1000 coconuts
2.	Tree climbing and coconut plucking:	
(i)	Time Rate	109.50 per day
(ii)	Piece Rate	1.80 per tree

3.	Grading of coconuts:	
(i)	Time Rate	83.00 per day
(ii)	Piece Rate	13.70 per 1000 coconuts
4.	Loading and unloading	130.40 per 1000 coconuts
5.	Un-skilled works	79.00 per day
6.	Cleaning, fertilizing and pesticiding of trees.	4.30 per tree

<u>EXPLANATIONS.--</u> (1) <u>Dearness Allowance:</u> In addition to the wages as fixed above, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as indicated below:-

- (i) The dearness allowance is linked to the Average Chennai City Consumer Price Index for the year 2000 (i.e.) 475 points Number with base 1982=100 and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points, an increase of 16 paise (Sixteen paise only) per day shall be paid as dearness allowance.
- (ii) The dearness allowance shall be calculated every year on the 1<sup>st</sup> April on the basis of the average of the indices for the preceding twelve months, that is, from January to December.
- (iii) The first calculation shall thus be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government</u>

  <u>Gazette</u> based on the Average Chennai City Consumer Price Index Number of the previous year.
- (2) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made between male and female workers.
- (3) To arrive at monthly rates of wages, the daily minimum wages shall be multiplied by 30.
- (4) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same higher wages shall be continued to be paid.
