## APPENDIX NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No. II(2)/LE/554/2004, published at pages 333 and 334 of Part II- Section 2 of the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>, dated the 14<sup>th</sup> July 2004, the Governor of Tamil Nadu, after consultation with the Advisory Board, hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in Sago industry, in the State of Tamil Nadu, specified in column (2) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof, the draft of the same having been previously published as required by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act.

2. This Notification shall come into force with effect on and from the date of its publication in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.

# THE SCHEDULE EMPLOYMENT IN SAGO INDUSTRY

- Explanations :- 1. (i) Classification of employees engaged in crushing, sizing, grinding, roasting, etc. into Grade-I and Grade-II is based on the physical capacity, skill efficiency and out turn of work and seniority.
  - (ii) Classification of drivers into Grade-I and Grade-II.-
- $\mbox{\bf Grade}$   $\,{\bf I}\,\,$  : Those who have completed five years of regular service.
- Grade II : Those who have not completed five years of service.
  - (iii) Classification of Clerks into Grade-I and Grade-II.
- **Grade** I: Those who have completed five years of regular service. **Grade** II: Those who have not completed five years of service.
- (2) <u>Dearness allowance</u>.- In addition to the above minimum rates of basic wages, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as follows:-
  - (i) The dearness allowance shall be linked to the average Consumer Price Index for the city of Chennai for the year 2000, namely, 475 points, with base 1982 = 100 and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points, Rs.5.28 (Rupees five and paise twenty eight only) per point per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.
  - (ii) The above revision shall be effective from the 1<sup>st</sup> April of every year on the basis of the average of the consumer price indices of the proceeding twelve months, namely, from January to December.
  - (iii) The first calculation shall be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u> based on the Average Consumer Price Index of the previous year.
- (3) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made in the case of men and women employees.
- (4) (i) To arrive at daily wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.
  - (ii)To arrive at the monthly wages, the daily wages shall multiplied by30.
- (5) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
