

Minimum Wages Act, 1948-Revision of minimum rates of wages for employment in Coffee Curing Works - Preliminary Notification-Issued.

## **ORDER:**

In the Government Order first read above the minimum rates of wages for the employment in Coffee Curing Works were last revised under the provisions of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948. The Government have now proposed to further revise these minimum rates of wages for Employment in Coffee Curing Works.

### APPENDIX.

#### NOTIFICATION.

The following draft of a Notification which it is proposed to issue in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948), is hereby published for information of all persons likely to be affected thereby, as required under clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act.

2. Notice is hereby given that the draft Notification will be taken into consideration on or after the expiry of two months from the date of publication of this Notification in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette and that any objection or suggestion, which may be received from any person with respect thereto, before the expiry of the aforesaid period, will be considered by the Government of Tamil Nadu. Objection or suggestion, if any, should be addressed to the Secretary to Government, Labour and Employment Department, Secretariat, Chennai-600 009 through the Commissioner of Labour, Chennai-600 006.

#### DRAFT NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour and Employment Department Notification No. II(2)/(LE)/691/2003, published at pages 405 and 406 of Part II - Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, dated the 29th October 2003, the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in Coffee-curing works in the State of Tamil Nadu specified in column (1) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (2) thereof.

<u>Explanations:-</u> (1) In addition to the minimum wages mentioned above, the employees shall be paid dearness allowance as indicated below:-

- (i) The wages notified above is linked to the Average Chennai City Consumer price Index for the year 2000 (that is 475 points with base 1982 = 100) and for every rise of one point over and above 475 points an increase of Rs.15 paise (fifteen paise only) shall be paid as dearness allowance per day.
- (ii) The revision of the dearness allowance shall be effective from the first April of every year on the basis of the average of the indices for the earlier twelve months, that is from January to December.
- (iii) The first calculation shall be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u> based on the Average Consumer Price Index of the previous year.
- (2) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made in the case of male and female workers.
- (3) (i) To arrive at daily wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.
  - (ii)To arrive at monthly wages, the daily wages shall be multiplied by 30.
- (4) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed therein, the same shall be continued to be paid.

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
