

The Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) – Revision of minimum rates of wages for the employment in Match Manufactory, based on the advice of the Committee – Orders – Issued.

### **ORDER:**

In the Government Order first read above, the minimum rates of wages for the employment in Match Manufactory were revised under clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948).

- 2. In the Government Order second read above, a Committee was appointed under the Chairmanship of the Additional Commissioner of Labour, Madurai for revision of minimum rates of wages for the employment in Match Manufactory. The said Committee conducted various meetings with the employers and employees and submitted a report to the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Labour.
- 3. The Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Labour in the letter third read above, has sent the report of the said Committee along with his recommendations to the Government for revision of minimum rates of wages for the employment in Match Manufactory.
- 4. The Government have carefully examined the report of the said Committee and the recommendations of the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Labour.

The Government accepts the recommendations of the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Labour and accordingly decided to revise the minimum rates of wages for the above said employment.

- 5. The appended Notification will, accordingly, be published in the <u>Tamil Nadu</u> <u>Government Gazette</u> both in English and Tamil.
- 6. The Works Manager, Government Central Press, Chennai 600 001 is requested to publish the Notification and send each five copies of the Gazette to the Government and the Commissioner of Labour for reference and record. The Director, Tamil Development and Information (Translation) Department, Secretariat, Chennai-600 009 is requested to send the Tamil translation of the Notification to the Works Manager, Government Central Press, Chennai 600 001.

# APPENDIX. NOTIFICATION.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 3 and sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Minimum Wages Act, 1948 (Central Act XI of 1948) and in supersession of the Labour Welfare and Skill Development Department Notification No.II(2)/LWSD/324/2022, published at page 700 of Part II-Section 2 of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette, dated the 4th May 2022, the Governor of Tamil Nadu, after considering the advice of the Committee appointed under clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the said Act, hereby revises the minimum rates of wages payable to the classes of employees in the employment in Match Manufactory in the State of Tamil Nadu specified in column (2) of the Schedule below, as specified in the corresponding entries in column (3) thereof.

2. This Notification shall come into force on and from the date of its publication in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u>.

**Explanations:- (1) Dearness Allowance**: In addition to the minimum rates of basic wages as fixed above, the employees shall be paid Dearness Allowance as indicated below.

(i) The Dearness Allowance is linked to the Average Chennai City Consumer Price Index for the year 2010, that is **161** points (with base year 2001=100) and for every raise of one point over and above 161 points, an increase of Rs.30.67 (Rupees Thirty and Paise sixty seven only) per month shall be paid as dearness allowance.

- (ii) The dearness allowance shall be calculated on the first April of every year on the basis of the average of the Consumer Price indices for the preceding twelve months, namely from January to December.
- (iii) The first calculation of the dearness allowance shall thus be effective from the date of publication of this Notification in the <u>Tamil Nadu Government Gazette</u> based on the average of Chennai City Consumer Price Index Number for the previous year.
- (2) Payment of dearness allowance in respect of piece rated employees will be subject to eight hours of work in a day. Where any piece-rate employee works less than eight hours a day, he shall be entiled to payment of proportionate dearness allowance only.
- (3) To arrive at daily wages, the monthly wages shall be divided by 26.
- (4) To arrive at monthly wages, the daily wages shall be multiplied by 30.
- (5) Where the nature of work is the same, no distinction in the payment of wages shall be made between men and women employees.
- (6) Wherever the existing wages are higher than the minimum wages fixed herein, the same shall be continued to be paid.
