CHAPTER – 1

1. INTRODUCTION

Social Welfare and Women Empowerment Department is implementing various welfare schemes to children, women, senior citizens and transgenders covering their nutrition, safety, socio-economic security, etc. through the Directorate of Social Welfare, the Directorate of children Welfare and Special Services and the Directorate of Integrated Child Development Services. This Department act as a Nodal Agency for various Social Security Pension Schemes which is being implemented by the Commissioner of Revenue Administration.

Welfare Schemes like Puthumaipen Thittam, Chief Minister Breakfast Scheme, Marriage Assistance, Girl Child Protection Scheme, Nutritious Meal Programme and Supply of Uniforms to School Children are implemented by the Directorate of Social Welfare. In order to protect the destitute, deserted women, young girls rescued from child marriage, Service Homes are established in six districts. There are 20 Working Women Hostels maintained in order to give safe and secured living places with all amenities and hygienic food at reasonable cost for working women coming from distant places to work in district headquarters and industrial areas.

In order to give self-employment, economic independence to women, 98 Women Tailoring Industrial Co-operative Societies and one Transgender Tailoring Society are established. Senior Citizens and Transgender are also benefited by various welfare schemes which lead them to live a respectful and dignified life.

Under Puratchi Thalaivar MGR Nutritious Meal programme, 42.71 lakh school children from standard 1 to 10 are being given hot, nutritious variety and tasty food. In Integrated Child Development Services, the children from birth to 6 years, the pregnant and lactating mothers are also provided nutritious food and health education.

Necessary assistance made available under various schemes implemented by the the Directorate of children Welfare and Special Services to the Children and Women who are in need of care and protection due to legal conflicts.

Social legislations to protect children, women and senior citizens like Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act,1956, Dowry Prohibition Act,1961, Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act,2005, Commission for Protection of Child Right Act, 2005 Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006, Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act,2007, Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act,2012 (POCSO), Protection of Women from Sexual Harassment at Workplace Act,2013, Tamil Nadu Hostels and Homes for Women and Children (Regulations) Act,2014 and Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act,2015 and Transgender persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019 are implemented and monitored by the Department of Social Welfare and Women Empowerment.

3 (a) Chief Minister Breakfast Scheme (CMBFS)

Tamil Nadu is a pioneer State in the country in launching the Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme with an objective to increase the enrolment in schools and also empower women by providing employment opportunities. An announcement was made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu under Rule.110 regarding the provision of Breakfast to the Primary School children of Government schools on all school working days to combat malnutrition and improve the nutritional status of children. The Chief Minister's Breakfast scheme was successfully launched on 15.09.2022 by Thiru. M.K. Stalin, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu. Subsequently the scheme was expanded to all 30,995 Government Primary schools covering 18,53,595 children across the State. Government order has been issued to the tune of Rs. 404.41 crore vide G.O (Ms) No 33. SW& WE (SW4-1) dept Date: 07.06.2023 for the expansion of the scheme.

Necessary Government Orders for the Expansion of CMBFS to all Govt aided Primary School Children in rural areas have been issued vide G.O (Ms) No.17, Social Welfare and Women Empowerment (SW 4 - 1) dept. Dt. 11.3.2024. A total sum of Rs.600.49 crore has been allocated in the Budget Estimate for the year 2024 - 25 for the implementation of Chief Minister Breakfast Scheme including expansion of CMBFS to Govt aided Schools in rural areas.

- To ensure that the children attend the schools without hunger
- To ensure that the children do not suffer from malnutrition
- To enhance the Nutritional status of the children, particularly high prevalence of anemia
- To increase the attendance / retention of the school children in the schools

II. Formation of Committees

Government order has been issued to form the Monitoring Committees at various levels vide G.O Ms. No. 60,SW & WE (SW -4 – 1), dt. 11.9.2023. Based on the above, State level Steering Committee, State level Monitoring Committee, District level Monitoring Committee, Greater Chennai Corporation Monitoring Committee, Corporation Monitoring Committee (except Greater Chennai Corporation), Municipal Level Monitoring Committee, Block level Monitoring Committee and School level Monitoring Committee have been formed at various levels to monitor the programme.

CHAPTER - 4

I. Integrated child development services scheme:

Integrated Child Development Services Scheme is aimed to improve the nutritional status of beneficiary by adapting life cycle approach through interventions for sustainable growth, strengthened with continuous care and focus on critical periods of nutritional vulnerability. Tamil Nadu has a long history of providing organized services through various programmes with special emphasis on nutrition, pre-school education, health and personal hygiene of the children up to 6 years of age, pregnant and lactating mothers. The scheme has been extended throughout in Tamil Nadu including unreachable areas in order to reach all beneficiaries.

The scheme is implemented through 54,449 anganwadi centres (49,509 Anganwadi Centres, 4940 Mini Anganwadi Centres) functioning under 434 ICDS projects. Out of 434 projects, 47 are Urban projects, 385 Rural projects and 2 are Tribal projects.

II. Objectives:

1. To lay foundation for the proper psychological, physical and social development of the child.
2. To improve nutritional and health status of children below six years.
3. To reduce incidence of mortality, morbidity, malnutrition and school dropouts.
4. To achieve effective coordination of policy and implementation.

5. Through proper nutrition and health education enhancing the capabilities of the mother to look after the normal health and nutritional needs of the child.
6. To make Anganwadi Centres as Vibrant Early Childhood Development centres.

III. Target groups/ beneficiaries:

- Children in the age group of 0- 6 years.
- Adolescent girls (14-18 years Adolescent Girls only in Aspirational Districts, namely Virudhunagar and Ramanathapuram)
- Pregnant women and Lactating mothers.
- Old Age Pensioners.

IV. Services delivered at anganwadi centre:

1. Early Childhood Care, Ante natal Care and Post natal care.
2. Growth Monitoring.
3. Supplementary nutrition.
4. Health services by Health Personnel (Village Health Nurse / Medical Officer).
5. Referral services.
6. Non-formal Pre School Education.
7. Nutrition & Health Education.
8. Provision of Supplementary Nutrition, Life Skill Training and Nutritional and Health Education to Adolescent Girls under Scheme for Adolescent Girls.
9. Provision of Nutritious Hot cooked Meal for the children in the age group of 2 to 6 years for 6 days in a week.

National Nutrition Mission (POSHAN Abhiyaan)

Government of India has setup National Nutrition Mission with a goal to achieve improvement in nutritional status of children from 0-6 years, Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers in a time bound manner during the next three years beginning 2017-2018.

V. Pre School Education:

Pre school education is imparted to 2+ to 6 years children. The objectives of the pre-school education is to promote holistic development of the child through playway method and thematic method of learning for smooth transition to primary education. Two sets of unisex uniforms made of banyan cloth is provided to pre school children. Pre-School Kits (for School readiness) is provided to Anganwadi centres every year.

VI. Anganwadi Employees:

The Anganwadi employees working in 54,449 Anganwadi centres are provided with special time scale of pay. The allowances like Dearness allowance. House Rent Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance, Medical Allowance, Hill Allowance and Winter Allowance are provided to them along with 3 % annual increment. The Anganwadi employees are eligible for lumpsum grant at the time of retirement, Rs.1,00,000/- is being paid to Anganwadi Workers as well as Mini Anganwadi Workers and Rs.50,000 /- to Anganwadi Helpers with effect from 01.10.2017. The Anganwadi Workers including Mini Anganwadi Workers and Anganwadi Helpers are being paid a special pension of Rs.2,000/- on their retirement from 01.10.2017. Every year, all Anganwadi employees are being provided two sarees with waist Coat as uniform.

VII. To avail the project benefits :

1. Formal application is not necessary to avail the benefits.
2. Income criteria is not insisted.
3. Once the pregnancy is confirmed the pregnant women can register her name in the near by Anganwadi Centre / Health Sub Centres / Urban Maternity Centre. By this, she will be able to get all Ante-natal and Post natal care.
4. Mothers are requested to come to the centre and take the weight of the child.
5. Nutrition and health services are provided to all children in the Anganwadi Centre irrespective of caste/creed/religion/income/profession etc.
6. Adolescent Girls (14-18 years) are also weighed in the Anganwadi centre in aspirational districts (Virudunagar and Ramnathapuram).
7. Community participation in the Project activities are encouraged.
8. All working group members such as Women Working Groups, Adolescent Girls Working Group, Community Working Group can participate in the monthly education sessions, Village Health Sanitation and Nutrition Day, Children's Day and various other celebrations are being organized every month by Anganwadi Workers.
