#### **CHAPTER – 1**

### **Introduction**

The Social Welfare and Nutritious Meal Programme Department was formed in the year 1947 with the primary objective of Community Development. Now the Department is focused to implement four important welfare schemes.

- Women Welfare
- Child Welfare
- Welfare of Senior Citizens
- Nutrition

These schemes are implemented through three Directorates, the Directorate of Social Welfare implementing schemes for Women Welfare, Child Welfare and welfare of the Senior Citizens, the Directorate of Social Defence implementing schemes for the protection of neglected and abandoned children, and the Commissionerate of Integrated Child Development Services taking care of the nutritional aspects of children and pregnant & lactating mothers.

The performances under these schemes are detailed in the following chapters.

## SOCIAL WELFARE

The schemes implemented by the Directorate of Social Welfare can be broadly classified into four major categories, such as Women Welfare, Child Welfare, Welfare of the Senior Citizen and Nutrition.

**Scheme 2:** Degree from collage/ distance education / Tamil Nadu Government recognized university.  
Diploma from institutions recognized by Directorate of Technical Education, Government of Tamil Nadu.Rs.50000/- per individual (Rs. 30,000 will be given by cheque and Rs.20,000 will be given as NSC.) and 4 gr. (22 ct.) gold coin for making 'Thirumangalyam' to the Degree / Diploma holders.

	b) Age Limit	:	5 to 10 years in the case of boys 5 to 18 years in the case of girls.

5. Sanitary Napkins and innerwear's also provided to them.
6. Financial support is extended to the ex-inmates of the children homes to continue higher education as follows:
- a) Professional Courses – Rs. 50,000 per annum per child.
- b) Degree Courses – Rs. 30,000 per annum per child.
- Diploma Courses – Rs. 30,000 per annum per child.
- 9 Other Activities : Arranging of excursion to the neighboring places for the inmates of Government Orphanages.
