ORDER:

The Hon'ble Chief Minister under Rule 110 on the floor of the Assembly on 01.09.2016 announced that PET-CT facility for diagnosing Cancer, would be provided at a cost of Rs.15 crore in Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Chennai.

2) In his letter third read above, the Officer on Special Duty, Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Chennai has stated that Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital is functioning with 10 Super Speciality departments and 7 Speciality departments. The department of Nuclear Medicine in the Hospital is the first of its kind in Government Hospitals in Tamil Nadu involving facilities such as SPECT, PET-CT, Nuclear therapy ward, Radioimmunoassay laboratory. He has further stated that necessary civil and electrical modifications as per AERB norms has been done for accommodating SPECT & PET – CT at Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Chennai. He has also stated that different rates has been fixed for the diagnostic studies and nuclear therapy to meet the cost of consumables and maintenance of the equipment by Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited (TNMSC) in the Government Order second read above.

3) He has also stated that for nuclear medicine department PET-CT (Positron Emission Tomography and Computed Tomography) facility is highly mandatory for the diagnosis and treatment of cancer, heart diseases and Neurological diseases duly enumerating its usage to the patients. He has therefore requested for administrative and financial sanction of funds of Rs.15 crore (Rupees fifteen crore only) for the procurement of PET-CT to Tamil Nadu Multi Super Speciality Hospital from the reserve funds of the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation and to recoup the cost as well as maintenance of the equipment from the already approved fees fixed in the Government Order second read above.

4) The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Director of Medical Education, accord administrative sanction for the purchase of a PET-CT equipment at a cost of Rs.15 crore (Rupees fifteen crore only) for Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Chennai from the reserve funds of the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation, with permission to the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation to recoup the cost and to maintain the equipment from the approved fees to be charged from the patients as per the rate fixed in the Government Order second read above.
