ORDER:

In his letter second read above, the Director of Medical Education has stated that in the Government Order first read above, orders have been issued for creation of 91 supernumerary posts in Madras Medical College, Chennai for the Government Medical Officers those who are undergoing Post Graduate Degree/Diploma course in the Self Financing Medical Institutions for the year 2015-2016 batch for the purpose of claiming salary.

2. The Director of Medical Education has, further, stated that during 2016-2017, 128 service candidates selected through Single Window System got allotment in various Self Financing Medical Institutions in Tamil Nadu.

3. The Director of Medical Education has also furnished the details in respect of number of Medical Officers, who are studying in Private Medical Colleges selected through Selection Committee / Single Window System for the year 2016-2017 along with the financial commitment involved in this regard as indicated below:-

The Director of Medical Education has therefore, requested the Government to increase the sanctioned strength of supernumerary posts in Madras Medical College, Chennai from 91 to 128 to claim the salary for the service candidates undergoing the Post Graduate courses for the year 2016-2017. The amount calculated for these 128 Service Post Graduates studying in Private Medical Institution is approximately Rs.7.68 crore per annum.

5. The Government have examined the proposal of the Director of Medical Education and have decided to accept the same and direct that the number of supernumerary posts sanctioned in the Government Order first read above be increased from 91 to 128 for the year 2016-2017 in the Madras Medical College, Chennai so as to enable to claim the salary for the Medical Officers who are undergoing Post Graduate Degree/Diploma/ M.Ch Courses in Self Financing Medical Institutions, on selection through Selection Committee/ Single Window System with an approximate annual expenditure of Rs.7.68 crore (Rupees Seven crore sixty eighty lakh only) per annum, subject to the conditions that

- i. The stipend received by the candidates from the respective Institutions may be deducted from the salary to be disbursed
- ii. The condition indicated above shall be in addition to the conditions stipulated in the Government Order first read above.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall be debited to the following Head of Account.

"2210-Medical and Public Health' 05 Medical Education, Training and Research-105-Allopathy States Expenditure AA Chennai Medical College 01- Salaries"

7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above shall constitute an item of "New Instrument of Service" and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Director of Medical Education is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period upto next Supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance

from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG.I) Department directly in Form "A" appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG.I) Department. The Director of Medical Education is requested to send necessary explanatory notes to include the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2017-2018 to Government in Finance (BG-I) Department at the appropriate time, without fail.
