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#### ORDER:

The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has informed that Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program is a World Bank supported project implemented by Department of Health and Family Welfare (DoH&FW) of Tamil Nadu Government on Program for Results (P for R) basis. The program claims at achieving SDG 3 target by ensuring health lives and promising wellbeing for all at all ages in Tamil Nadu. The total budget of the program is 287 million US\$ over a period of 5 years which will supplement the overall budget of Government of Tamil Nadu in health department of 4,990 million US\$ in next 5 years to achieve the results. The loan agreement was signed on 04.06.2019 and the effectiveness date is declared as 29.07.2019. In the Government Order second read above, the Administrative Sanction of the project was accorded. The Goal of the Project is to improve quality of care, strengthen management of non-communicable diseases and injuries and reduce inequities in reproductive and child health services in Tamil Nadu. The project is being implemented and the first-year activity carried out from July 2019 to March 2020. In first year, all the disbursement linked results were achieved and disbursement claimed to the World Bank of USD 5,20,23,500 and the budget allotted for the first year activity was sanctioned in the Government Order third read above.

2. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has forwarded the proposal approved by the State Empowered Committee headed by the Chief Secretary to the completion of the Year I STEPS Survey in implementation of the second year activities for Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program as detailed below:-

With the fact that whether "patients with Hypertension and Diabetes whose blood pressure and blood sugar are under control" would be evidenced by a periodical STEPS survey. In the Government Order first read above, the Government has accorded permission to the Project Director to conduct the STEPS survey in house by engaging the Institute of Community Medicine of Madras Medical College, Chennai (ICM) in the years 1, 3 and 5 (3 rounds) through a detailed Terms of Reference vetted by the World Bank and an amount of Rs.93,12,156/- (Rupees ninety three lakhs twelve thousand one hundred and fifty six only) for conducting the STEPS survey in the year 1.

With an intent of increasing the credibility of the survey, the World Bank recommended to engage NIE-ICMR Chennai. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program, Institute of Community Medicine, Madras Medical College, Chennai and National Institute of Epidemiology on 23.10.2019, with defined roles and responsibilities among the three parties. The Project Steering Committee approved the proposal to conduct the STEPS survey for the year 1 engaging Institute of Community Medicine and National Institute of Epidemiology on 09.12.2019.

As per the agreed MoU, National Institute of Epidemiology had submitted a revised budget estimate for the conduct of the survey with actual budget of Rs. 1,63,87,496, as detailed below.

The survey was initiated as on 06.01.2020. Out of the total 193 clusters, survey has been completed in 151 clusters. Interim Report of 125 clusters, where in 80% response rate has been obtained, along with the fact sheet has been submitted to the Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program and the World Bank. The World Bank has released US\$ 4,985,000 (Rs.34,73,69,755) towards completion of the first year STEPS survey. Owing to the COVID pandemic and the lockdown restrictions, the survey of the remaining clusters has been put on hold and is expected to be continued once the lockdown restrictions are relaxed.

With the above background, the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has proposed to claim the additional expenditure incurred in the conduct of the Year I STEPS survey and to complete the survey in Year II owing to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic with the cost detailed below:-

3. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program has therefore requested the Government to issue orders to approve the budget allocation amount of Rs.70,75,340/- to the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health Systems Reform Program towards the completion of the Year I STEPS survey and to permit him to reallocate the funds provided across the different components as per the need within the total amount sanctioned.

4. The Government after careful consideration of the proposal of the Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program have decided to accept the same and issue accordingly following orders:-

- i. Sanction is accorded for an amount of Rs.70,75,340/- (Rupees Seventy Lakh Seventy Five Thousand Three Hundred and Forty only) to Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program towards the completion of the Year I STEPS Survey as detailed in the annexure to this Government order.
- ii. The Project Director, Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Program is permitted to re-allocate the fund provided across the different components as per the need within the total amount sanctioned above.

5. The expenditure sanctioned in para 4 (i) above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

2210 – Medical and Public Health – 01 Urban Health Services – Allopathy – 110 Hospitals and Dispensaries – Externally Aided Project – PG – Tamil Nadu Health System Reform Project – 309 Grants in Aid – 03 Grants for Specific Schemes.
