



## ABSTRACT

Medical Education – Sanction an amount of Rs.16.00 Crore for creating a Revolving Fund to be operated by the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited to enable payment of all type of essential fee and hostel fee for the students who have got admission under the 7.5% preferential allotment of seats in MBBS / BDS Course - Administrative and Financial sanction accorded – Orders issued.

## ORDER:

Under Rule 110, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu made the following announcement on the Floor of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly on 21.03.2020:-

“xxx அரசுப் பள்ளிகள், மாநகராட்சி பள்ளிகள், நகராட்சி பள்ளிகள், ஆதிதிராவிடர், பழங்குடியினர் நலப் பள்ளிகள், சுள்ளர் சீமரபிணப் பள்ளிகள், வனத்துறை பள்ளிகள் ஆகிய பள்ளிகளில், 1 முதல் 12 ஆம் வகுப்பு வரை பயின்று நி்ட் தேர்ச்சி பெற்ற மாணாக்கர்களுக்கு பிரத்யேகமாக ஒரு உள் ஒதுக்கீடு கொடுக்க வகை செய்யும் சிறப்புச் சட்டம் ஒன்றை இயற்ற வகை செய்ய ஏதுவாக தேவைப்படும் அனைத்து புள்ளி விவரங்களையும் தொகுத்து உரிய பரிந்துரையையும் தமிழ்நாடு அரசுக்கு வழங்க, ஒய்வு பெற்ற ஒரு உயர்நீதிமன்ற நீதிபதி தலைமையில், ஒரு ஆணையம் அமைக்கப்படும்.

xxx மேற்கூறிய பள்ளி மாணவர்கள் மருத்துவப் படிப்புகளில் குறைந்த அளவிலேயே சேர்வதற்கான காரணங்களை ஆராய்ந்து, அவர்களின் சமூக பொருளாதார நிலையினை மதிப்பீடு செய்து,

xxx தனது பரிந்துரையை ஒரு மாத காலத்திற்குள் இவ்வாணையம் அரசுக்கு சமர்ப்பிக்கும்”.

2. Based on the 110 announcement by Hon'ble Chief Minister a Committee was constituted under Retired High Court Justice Kalaiselvan to study and give a report on the challenges faced by students studying in Government School as per the terms of reference. The report was examined and approved by the State Cabinet and based on decisions of Cabinet, initially an ordinance was passed and then during the ensuing Assembly Session a bill was unanimously passed and enacted. After the first round of counselling this has enabled preferential allocation of initially 405 MBBS and BDS seats in Government in the State Quota (Both from

Government Medical Colleges and Self Financing Professional Medical Colleges) for the students who studied in Government Schools as defined in the landmark Act.

3. The Hon'ble Chief Minister in his address to the students and parents in a function organised for distributing the allotment order for the top 10 students under this category, held on 18.11.2020 at the counselling centre at Nehru Stadium, has stated that arrangements would be made for Post Matric Scholarship and other assistance to the students getting admission under this category. The extract may be seen below:-

4. As a follow up Hon'ble Chief Minister has made an announcement on 21.11.2020 as follows:-

மருத்துவக் கல்லூரிகள் மற்றும் பல்மருத்துவ கல்லூரிகளில் சேர ஆணை பெற்றுள்ள அனைத்து அரசுப் பள்ளி மாணாக்கர்களின் கல்விக் கட்டணத்தை உதவித்தொகை (Scholarship) அனுமதி வரும் வரை காத்திராமல், உடனடியாக செலுத்தும் விதமாக, தமிழ்நாடு மருத்துவ சேவை கழகத்தில் ஒரு கழல் நிதியை உருவாக்க நான் உத்தரவிட்டுள்ளேன். அந்நிதியில் இருந்து மாணாக்கர்களுக்கான கல்வி, விடுதி கட்டணங்கள் போன்றவற்றை மாண்புமிகு அம்மாவின அரசே நேரடியாக கல்லூரி நிர்வாகத்திற்கு செலுத்தும்.

5. To give effect to the above announcement, proposal were called for from the Selection Committee and the Director of Medical Education to state that, tentatively this would be the cost of fees and other charges which would be required, to be paid by the students of MBBS / BDS.

6. In the letter fourth read above, the Director of Medical Education has furnished the tentative cost of fees and other charges which would be required to be paid by the students of MBBS / BDS under the 7.5% preferential allotment of seats for the students who have studied in the Government Schools for the first year of MBBS / BDS Course is as follows:-

7. The Government have examined the proposal of the Director of Medical Education and decided to accept it. Accordingly, the Government accord sanction for a sum of Rs.16.00 Crore (Rupees Sixteen Crore only) for creating a Revolving Fund to be operated by the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited to enable payment of all type of essential fee and hostel fee for the students who have got admission under the 7.5% preferential allotment of seats in MBBS / BDS Course as annexed to this Government Order and separate action will be initiated to avail the benefits of eligible scholarship and educational assistance under various categories for eligible students from such categories and the amount so received will be used to partly replenish to Revolving Fund from the concerned Departments.

8. The expenditure sanctioned in para 7 above, shall be debited to the following new head of account opened under D. No. 19-03:-

"2210 Medical and Public Health – 05 Medical Education Training and Research – 105 Allopathy – State's Expenditure KG Payment of all fees for the students admitted under the 7.5% preferential allotment of seats in MBBS/BDS course – 312 Scholarships and stipends 09 others.

9. The Director of Medical Education is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 7 above.

10. The Director of Medical Education is the Estimating, Reconciling and Controlling Authority for the above said new head of account.

11. The Pay and Accounts Officer / Treasury Officers concerned are directed to open the above new head of account in their books.

12. The expenditure sanctioned in para 7 above shall constitute an item of "New Service" and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Director of Medical Education is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period upto next Supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG-I) Department directly in Form "A" appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG-I) Department. The Director of Medical Education is requested to send necessary explanatory notes to include the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2020-21 to Finance (BG-I/ Health-II) Department at the appropriate time without fail.

13. Initially the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited is permitted to meet out the expenditure from its Personal Deposit Account and the same will be reimbursed later by release of Contingency Fund or after Supplementary Estimate.

14. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O.No.358/DS(B)/Fin(BG-II)/2020, dated 30.11.2020 and ASL No. 981(Nine hundred and eighty one).
